

Reflection

Consider What You Carry—Or Don't

Abba Moses, a fourth-century bandit turned desert monastic, was heard to say, "Go, sit in your cell, and your cell will teach you everything." In today's Gospel, I hear Jesus saying, "Go out, and let what you carry—or don't—teach you." If you upended my backpack on the table, it would tell you everything. I'm carrying all the things Jesus warns against: money and food; socks, in case my feet get cold in my sandals. It's entirely possible there's a second tunic buried at the bottom.

I'm tempted to say Jesus' lesson here isn't for me. I'm not one of the Twelve being sent out to vanquish unclean spirits, or even a modern-day missionary. I spend most of my days in my cell-like office, writing and talking with students. Or perhaps I should take it as merely metaphorical advice: don't let yourself get weighed down with things. But I suspect I'd be missing the point. We are all missioned by Jesus, sent out each day to bear the Good News and each other's burdens, whether we are shepherds and dressers of sycamores like Amos, or monks in the desert, or teachers in the classroom.

The Gospel asks me to consider what I carry in the light of Jesus' commission, to see what I have, not from the perspective of my needs, but those of others. If I took out the second tunic, what might I be able to fit in that would help me drive out the demons of injustice, or ease the burdens of the poor, the weary, and the sick?


