

Reflection

When our lives become centered on personal gain and prestige, our interest turns inward. Others become competitors to be bested rather than brothers and sisters I Christ to be served and cared for. Cardinal Merry del Val wrote a beautiful prayers called the Litany of Humility. The last line resonates with Jesus's message to the disciples and St. James's letter to the early church: "That others become holier than I, provided that I may become as holy as I should, Jesus, grant me the grace to desire it." May this be our prayer too.

Children of All Ages

He placed a child in their midst . . . And as he did, he embraced that child. Then he spoke these two important words to his disciples. Become like children. Welcome the children.

Why a child? A child is one who lacks things. Like what? Experience . . . command of language . . . knowledge . . . power . . . independence . . . legal rights. As such, every child is at a distinct disadvantage in society. Easily victimized. In order to survive and grow, a child needs to trust in the care and tenderness of others. We adults may think we have little in common with a child. But we do. A sudden illness, a fire or flood, the loss of a steady income, the natural aging process—each can reduce us to the plight of a child. We too need trust to survive—trust in others and in the One who sent Jesus.

Welcome the children. Some in our midst do this in exceptional ways: parents, grandparents, teachers, coaches, pediatricians, caregivers. But who else in our midst, besides children, are easily preyed upon because they lack experience, command of language, power, independence, legal rights? What about the elderly, the ill, immigrants, the homeless, the lonely, the voiceless, the economically poor, or those victimized because of race, age, gender?

Jesus is placing individuals in our midst today, asking us to emulate and earn their trust, asking us to welcome them with our love.

<u>Sacristan</u>— this ministry is responsible for preparation of the worship space for Mass, including the sacred vessels, and for clean-up after the Mass. In addition, Sacristans act as coordinator for the other liturgical ministries prior to Mass, making sure that ministers are in place for those duties.

<u>Lector</u>— These ministers have the special opportunity to personally and prayerfully proclaim the Word of God.
