

Reflection

"For his sake I have accepted the loss of all things." Is there something that you have recently lost? Perhaps you've lost a family member or friend to illness, or a job or opportunity. Perhaps you've had an argument with someone close to you. Think about the things you have "lost" recently and put them in the context of Paul's words. Lost things are not truly lost if our pursuit is heaven.

A New Kind of Freedom

Where was he? Where was the man caught in adultery with this woman? No one commits this particular sin on his or her own. Indeed, the scribes and Pharisees say they caught the woman *in the very act* of adultery. Someone must have been with her. Where was he now?

I wonder if Jesus asked that question himself, if that's what he pondered as he scribbled in the sand. The law these men self-righteously cite is clear: In cases of adultery "both the man and the woman . . . shall die" (Deut 22:22). Yet they brought her, and her alone, to stand in shame. The hypocrisy is thick. The injustice is evident. And Jesus would have none of it.

In refusing to play their game, Jesus confronted the social structures, legal disparities, and cultural norms that would shield a man but stone a woman. This is not what God wants, his actions seem to say. Standing up to the crowd, Jesus questioned the conventional—tearing down the façade of fairness we tack up in our desperate attempt to hide the mess we make of the world.

But in pointing out injustice, Jesus didn't try to round up all the guilty parties. He didn't demand that the man be punished with equal force. That's *our* notion of justice. Instead, Jesus let everyone go, and so offered a new kind of freedom. What he said to the woman, he says to us—faithful disciples, Pharisees and scribes that we are—"Go . . . and sin no more."
