

#### Second Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy) April 24, 2022

#### Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16

More than ever, believers in the Lord, great numbers of men and women, were added to them.

#### Psalm 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24

Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

#### Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19

I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever.

#### John 20:19-31

Eight days later Jesus came and stood in their midst.

#### Reflection

Mary Magdalene is not running back to her friends and telling them Jesus has risen from the dead. Instead, she's mortified that someone has stolen his body from his grave. The apostles are in devastating grief when they encounter the reality of Jesus's resurrection. They watched someone they love dearly die violently. Not only are they experiencing the trauma of losing Jesus but there's also the fear that they will be next. To be presented with the reality that Jesus actually rose from the dead, and is really the Messiah, requires emotional whiplash. Peter and John are putting the pieces together slowly. As you encounter the celebration of Easter this year, allow yourself to sympathize with the apostles' human journey throughout the Triduum.

#### **Resurrection's Questions**

A gifted gardener, my mother was rehabilitating an orchid even as her ninety-three-year-old body was overwhelmed by an avalanche of medical problems. The plant became my responsibility during the sad and exhausting weeks when hospice care allowed her to die at home. The morning after her death I was astonished to discover six large flowers on what, the day before, had been an arid stalk. Incredulous, I found myself asking Mary's question to the angel Gabriel: How can this be?

I remember that orchid each Easter morning when I pray about the empty tomb. I wonder if the apostles, too, instinctively uttered Mary's question, echoing the words that began the event whose completion we celebrate today. Mary believed that what was spoken to her by the Lord would be fulfilled. Do we?

In her amazement, Mary of Magdala could only assume that "they have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." Now, centuries later, we would do well to ask, "Where have *we* put the Lord?" Do we leave him in the tomb, so we won't be bothered by his questions?

"Who do you say that I am?" the risen Lord asks us. If only he would be satisfied with a catechetical answer! But no, he insists on meeting us where we are—at the cradle and the grave, the kitchen table and factory floor. He is always with us—urging faith, astonishing us with Scripture's hope.

Let us risk hope, at least today, this day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad. The enemy has been vanquished and we are safe, hidden with Christ in God.

## FAITH FORMATION

### Next Year: 2022-2023

## **Elementary School (K-5)**

Students entering Kindergarten through 5th grade attend Family Sessions together with their parents (younger siblings are always welcome). Classroom sessions are held on alternate weekends and will be divided into K-2 and 3-5 cohorts.

## First Communion: 2<sup>nd</sup> grade & up

Students in 2nd grade or older are eligible to receive First Reconciliation and First Communion. The preparation process includes two sacraments, plus two day retreats and additional textbooks. If your child is older than 2nd grade and needs to receive First Communion, please let us know.

## Middle School (6-8)

Grades 6-8 will attend Family Session (with parents) and classroom sessions (without parents) on alternating weekends as one large group. During classroom sessions, students will use Lifeteen's EDGE curriculum in small groups. 8th grade students may also begin the Confirmation process (see the next column).

## Confirmation: 8<sup>th</sup> grade & up

Holy Cross's Confirmation class is a one-year process for students in 8th grade and older. It includes Faith Formation classes (alternating Family Session and middle school classroom) and new this year: an evening deep-dive during the week.

## Post-Confirmation Classes (high school, 9-12)

Confirmation is not graduation. Students in high school who have been Confirmed have 3 options this fall:

•Volunteer as a teacher or class aide. One of the best ways to learn about your faith is to teach it to others.

•Attend a new class specifically for high schoolers. This class meets weekly (Family Sessions are not included).

•Attend Family Session with younger siblings. Be a role model for your siblings and give the gift of your time.

If you're in high school, but aren't yet Confirmed, please let us know during registration!

## **Classes for Adults**

Starting this fall, adults can attend classes, too! This program is for adults who don't have any children in Faith Formation AND for adults with children in classroom sessions (Parents attend Family Sessions with their children).

## **Sacraments for Adults: OCIA**

The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA) is the preparation process for adults who are interested in becoming Catholic or receiving a sacrament later in life. This process includes adults who have not yet been baptized or received First Reconciliation, First Communion, and/or Confirmation.

## **PS: Baptisms**

Children ages 6 and under may be baptized anytime (begin the process by calling the front office). Children and teens ages 7+ who need to be baptized will do so at Easter Vigil (begin this process by contacting Anna). Adults attend OCIA (see above).
