Reflection

The crosses we are called to take up often seem small in comparison to Christ's. But Christ walks with us even in our smallest sufferings. Even mundane moments of irritation and struggle can become moments in which we practice virtue. We can follow Christ by responding to these frustrations with patience, fortitude, and empathy for others who are involved.

God's Love Refracted

There's an aphorism repeated often in the writings of the medieval church: per crucem ad lucem, through the cross to the light.

God loves us passionately and wants to bring us joy and flourishing, but this doesn't preclude a cross. God's love is refracted through the cross, which often makes it hard to see or recognize. But if we are to learn to trust—to place the weight of our lives on the love of God—we can only learn this through the cross.

We come to know and trust God's love more deeply through our own crosses, the things that make us feel we cannot go on, the things that make us tired—the job loss, the break up, the sickness, the loneliness, the long struggle with sin, the estrangement from a friend, the disappointment, the deaths of those we love, our own death.

I wish there were some easier way, some way to learn to trust God that was paved with luxury and endless ease, but per crucem ad lucem: the way to the light runs smack dab through darkness or more accurately, we discover the light speeding toward us in these very dark places.

And certainly the reality of the changeless love of God doesn't mean we always feel God's love or God's nearness. Often in seasons of suffering it feels like God is nowhere to be found.

God's love does not extinguish sorrow. Not yet, anyway. His love is steadfast but incalculable, gentle but untamable. It is not bound by our opinions. It shakes us yet sets us free. It slays us and also teaches us how to live. It is as troubling as it is comforting. It takes us as we are but insists on making us whole and vibrantly alive and that process is long and painful. . . .

In the end, per crucem ad lucem, this pilgrimage to the light, does not run only through our own crosses, but through the cross of Jesus.

~3~


You will be able to correct any mistakes you might make. You have an eraser. God has given us the grace to be forgiven by saying to God, "I am sorry".


