Reflection

In the gospel, neither brother acts with complete honesty or integrity; it would be nice if there were a son who obeyed his father in both word and deed. Perhaps this is pointing to the fact that none of us is perfect, that all of us are in need of God's generous mercy. We don't always think of ourselves as being needy before God; we would like to believe we have merited the good things God gives us. But this gospel challenges us to remember to receive them all as gifts given freely.

Blessedly Backward Logic

As children we complained, "That's not fair!" Exasperated adults likely retorted, "Life's not fair!" Jesus gives this earthly cliché an eternal twist: heaven will also be unfair by human standards. Those who have sinned seriously and publicly can enter the kingdom first. But rather than stomping our feet like jealous children, we can find great hope in this promise of abundant mercy.

Jesus confronts the chief priests and elders—the honored holy ones—with a pointed parable about sin and second chances. It's striking that Jesus uses a family to prove his point; many of his parables draw from landowners and servants, which could make the same case. Instead, he tells of a father and his two sons, reminding us we have at times acted like both of them. Jesus underscores the power of changing our minds, turning from sin to God: the transformation of conversion. This surrender will open the door to the kingdom.

Those with the most to lose (in wealth, power, or privilege) often find it hardest to imagine that the last could be first. Yet such is the blessedly backward logic of God's love. This promise extends the nudge we need to turn our initial no into a yes, to overcome our internal protests—even our temper tantrums at the feet of God.

We are all given the same command, to go out and work in the vineyard. It's never too late to change our minds and turn back.

God's ways are not our ways. Thank God for that.
