Reflection

Many of us hesitate to ask God for too much; we strive to pray for the “right” things so that we will not be too disappointed if our desires aren’t met. But God already knows all our needs and all our desires and all our thoughts; bringing them to prayer is a way of growing our knowledge of God, not God’s knowledge of us. Our readiness before God is unchangeable and indisputable fact; our acknowledgment of it is simply a way to grow in humility.

Clothed in Christ

I, God your Father, the eternal Trinity, in my infinite eternal providence, saw to it that humankind was reclothed when you had lost the garment of innocence and were stripped of all virtue and perishing from hunger and dying from the cold in this life of pilgrimage. You were subjected to every sort of misery. . . . But I, supreme providence, saw to [your need]. Constrained not by any justice or virtue of yours but by my own goodness, I clothed you anew in the person of this gentle loving Word, my only-begotten Son. He, by stripping himself of life, clothed you anew in innocence and grace [cf. Gal 3:27]. . . .

My providence provides for this . . . with the gentleness of holy baptism. Thus have you been clothed anew. I made you warm again when my only-begotten Son revealed to you through his pierced body the fire of my charity hidden under the ashes of your humanity. And would this not warm the frozen human heart? . . .

My providence has given you food to strengthen you while you are pilgrim travelers in this life. And I have so weakened your enemies that no one but you yourself can harm you. The road is cemented with the blood of my Truth so that you may reach the end for which I created you.

And what food is this? It is the body and blood of Christ crucified, wholly God, wholly human, the food of angels and the food of life.

St. Catherine of Siena, *The Dialogue*
Catherine of Siena (1347–1380) was a mystic and Dominican tertiary who counseled and challenged popes and rulers. She is known for her many spiritual writings and is a Doctor of the Church.

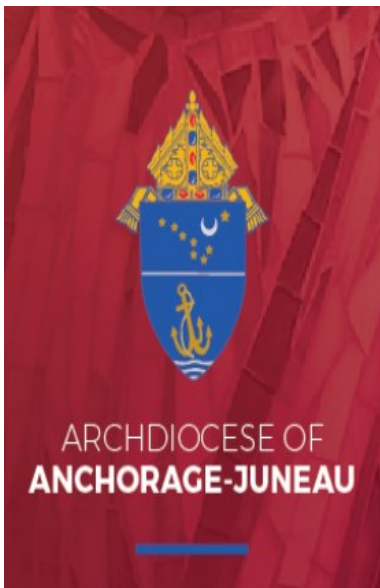

Since the rebate is not taxed by the Archdiocese, unlike income from weekly collections and online giving, the rebate is paid in full at 100% to Holy Cross. 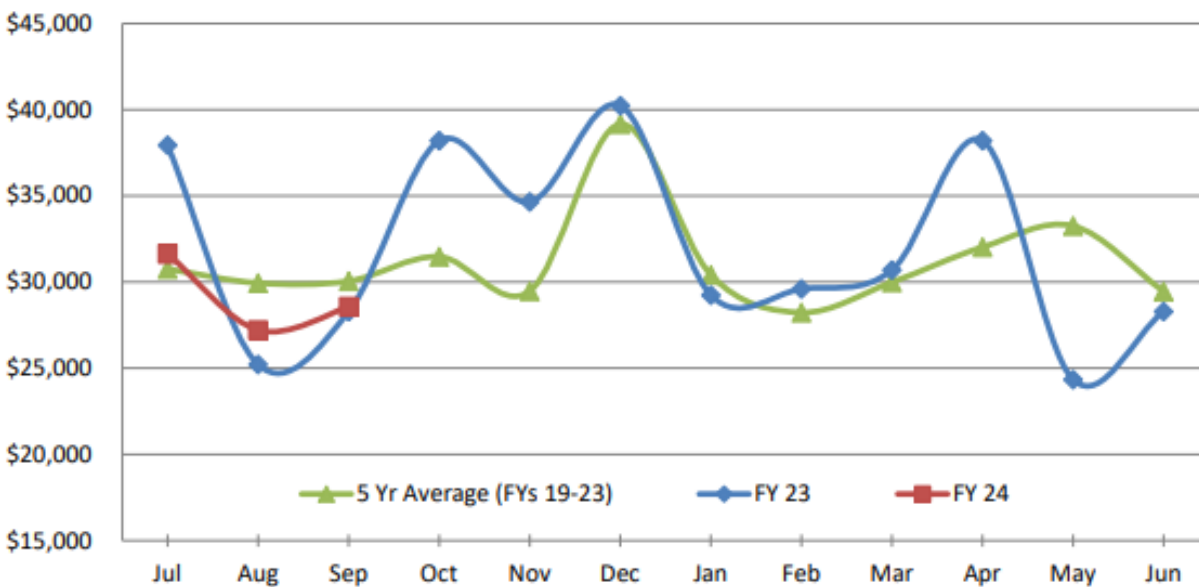

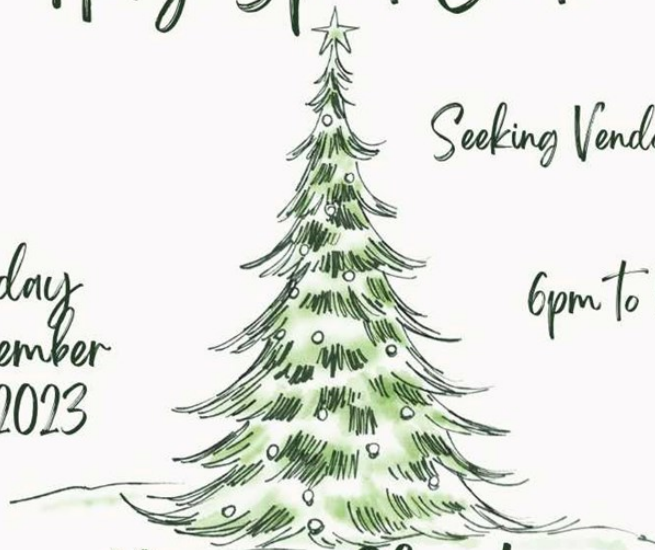

Diane and I would like to thank the staff and the people of Holy Cross parish for the joyful sendoff for us on September 24th and the beautiful Funeral Mass and reception for our daughter Cindy on September 28th. Both "celebrations" meant a lot to us.

The kind words that Fr. Pat said about me at the end of the 11 o'clock Mass on Sunday, the 24th, were greatly appreciated. The food was plentiful, as Fr. Dan had promised. It was wonderful to see so many people there to bid us farewell. We also appreciated all the well wishes in the book, the cards and the amazing spiritual bouquets from so many of you - offering Masses, Praying the Rosary or the Chaplet, Novenas, Visiting the Blessed Sacrament, Acts of Penance, Fasting - very meaningful gestures on our behalf. It is so very heartwarming. We are saddened to be leaving Holy Cross, and so grateful for the time we had serving in the parish and getting to know so many wonderful, caring people. We will miss you all.

Even sadder, the very next day, our daughter Cindy died at the age of 56. Her health began to fail this summer. We had prayed often for her during the Universal Prayers at Mass. At

the Mass for her on Thursday, September 28th, Fr. Dan's homily for Cindy was so moving. He knew her so well and had anointed her in the hospital before she died. The Mass was a true celebration of the life of an "angel", who had never sinned, as Fr. Dan described her. Once again the support of the of the people of Holy Cross at the time of sorrow was greatly appreciated by all our family.

We would especially like to thank Chelsea, Jerica, and Marilyn Kerr, for all the arrangements they made for the reception that followed the Funeral Mass. We are sure that many others assisted, and we thank them as well. It was a lovely reception.

Again, we are doubly saddened to be leaving the parish and Alaska, but will return and visit you all soon. I continue to be assigned at All Saints parish in Mesa, AZ. If you are ever in the area on vacation, please stop by and visit. We look forward to seeing you all again. Thank you all for your love and support over the years.

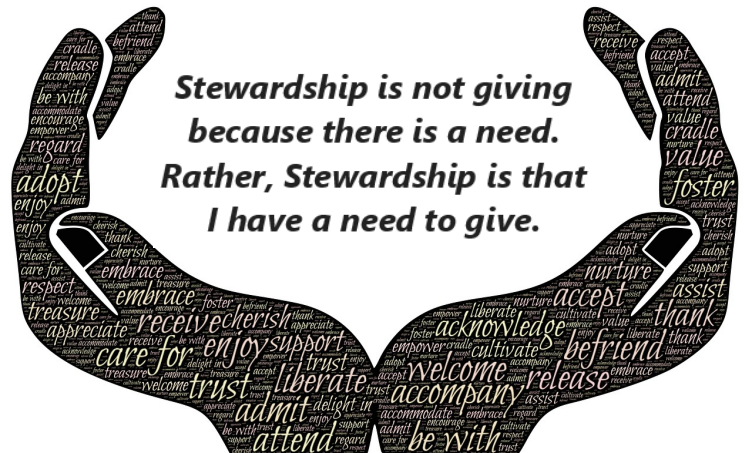
