Reflection

We don't always get to see the promise of this gospel played out; too often in this life, it seems that those with power only get more power and those without only fall further and further. Our sinful structures are cyclical by nature, and these cycles can seem insurmountably hard to break. But sometimes cycles are broken: parents can break intergenerational cycles of abuse and trauma, for instance, by sacrificing a power-based relationship for one based on love.

Sunday Mornings

Before our first child was weaned—and for a long time after—church was an ordeal. Exhausted, we would drag ourselves out of bed, wake up a sleeping baby, wrestle her into the car seat, load up half the nursery into a diaper bag, and make our way to Mass—only to spend an hour bouncing and soothing and trying to shush our daughter's constant cries for attention.

Church was a chore. And yet, we did it. Why?

It wasn't to receive the Gospel of God that St. Paul proclaims. In fact, I would be hard pressed to recall a single sermon from all those years. Rather, we dragged our daughter (and her sisters after her) to church because we knew that we were setting an example. Like eating family dinners together, telling the truth, helping around the house, and showing kindness to strangers, going to Mass modeled a kind of life that my wife and I found meaningful and wanted to share.

Parents offer a model not only for their children, but for all of us. Christ gave himself away in love, and calls us to do the same. Sunday mornings I look around and see all these ordinary saints, with their squirrelly kids, teaching me how to imitate Christ. And I am reminded of that time when my wife abandoned any attempt to get something out of Mass for herself, and instead took our screaming daughter out of my arms, carried her to the corner of the cry room, and discretely began to nurse her. In that moment, I heard the words anew: Take. Eat. This is my body. For you.
