# Reflection

Jesus' haste and clarity of mission might seem to contrast with most of our lives. After decades of prayer and discernment, he is confident in his mission when the right time comes for it. He is now in haste; Mark's gospel leaves no room for delay. In this passage, he arrives in Capernaum and sets straight to teaching. It is perhaps unusual for us to be called with such clarity; our missions usually unfold over a lifetime. But when we attend to God's callings, we can move with the same confidence that Jesus does.

# **Authority to Teach**

To know Christ is to know God. Christ is the homily that keeps explaining to us continually that God is love, that God is power, that the Spirit of the Lord upon Jesus Christ, that he is the divine Word, God's presence among us.

Jesus Christ and the gospel are not two separate things. The gospel is not a biography of Christ; for St. Paul, the gospel is the living power of God [cf. Rom 1:16]. Reading the gospel is not like reading an ordinary book.

You have to fill yourself with faith and stress the living Jesus Christ, the revelation of the Father. You must feel, though it be in silence, without anyone's speaking, with deep faith in your heart, that Christ is God's homily preaching to you while you try to fill yourself with the divine power that has come in Christ Jesus.

St. Oscar Romero, The Violence of Love
Oscar Romero (1917–1980) became archbishop of San Salvador in 1977. A
prophetic voice of the poor, he was martyred at the altar while saying
Mass. Romero was canonized in 2018.
